RE:	Final Enrollment Report for Fall Semester 2004

Enclosed is the Tenth Day Enrollment Report for Fall Semester 2004. For the first time, this report is taken from the Tenth Day Snapshot data in EDW. As a result, please note:

- Class levels (Freshmen, Sophomores, etc.) cannot be reported until after academic history conversion later in the fall.
- Exact comparisons to legacy data are difficult because of different information. For example, 301 extra-mural students show as registrants with Banner data but were never included in prior years.
- > More significantly, we have discovered an error in conversion of continuing students from legacy data that overrepresents the number of international students by as many as 1325 due to their conversion to a wrong visa type.
- > As a result, this report should be considered preliminary pending conversion and conversations between OAR and DMI regarding definitions for counts.

As of the Tenth Day Snapshot enrollment is 40,360 (including 301 extra-mural students). This is 1,435 more students (or 3.7%) than the corresponding date last year and represents the largest enrollment in the history of the campus.

- \geq Undergraduate + 671 (2.3%)
- ➢ Graduate + 760 (8.2%)
 ➢ Professional + 4 (0.4%)
- \geq New freshmen +447 (6.6%)
- New transfers +102(9.5%)
